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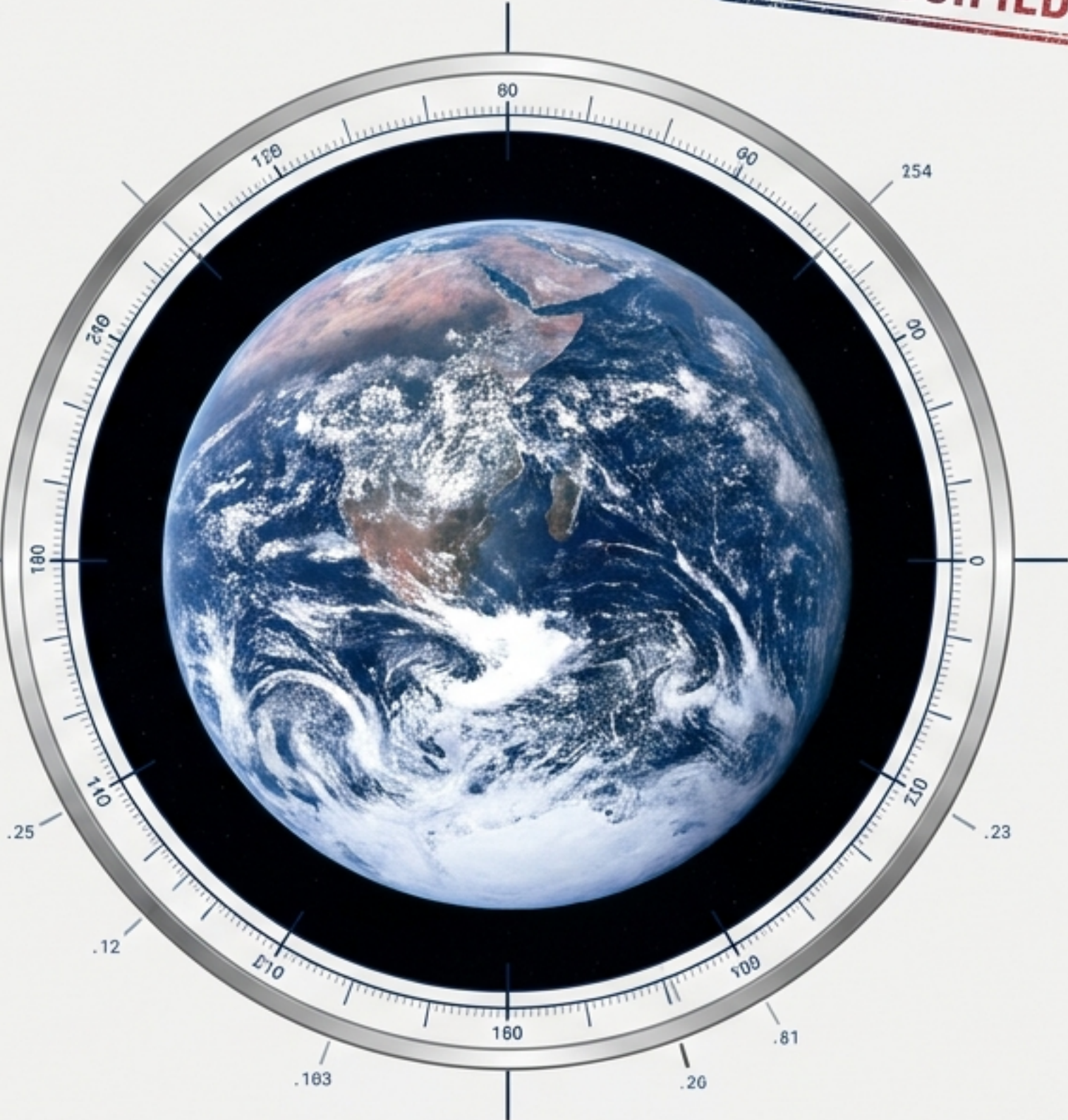

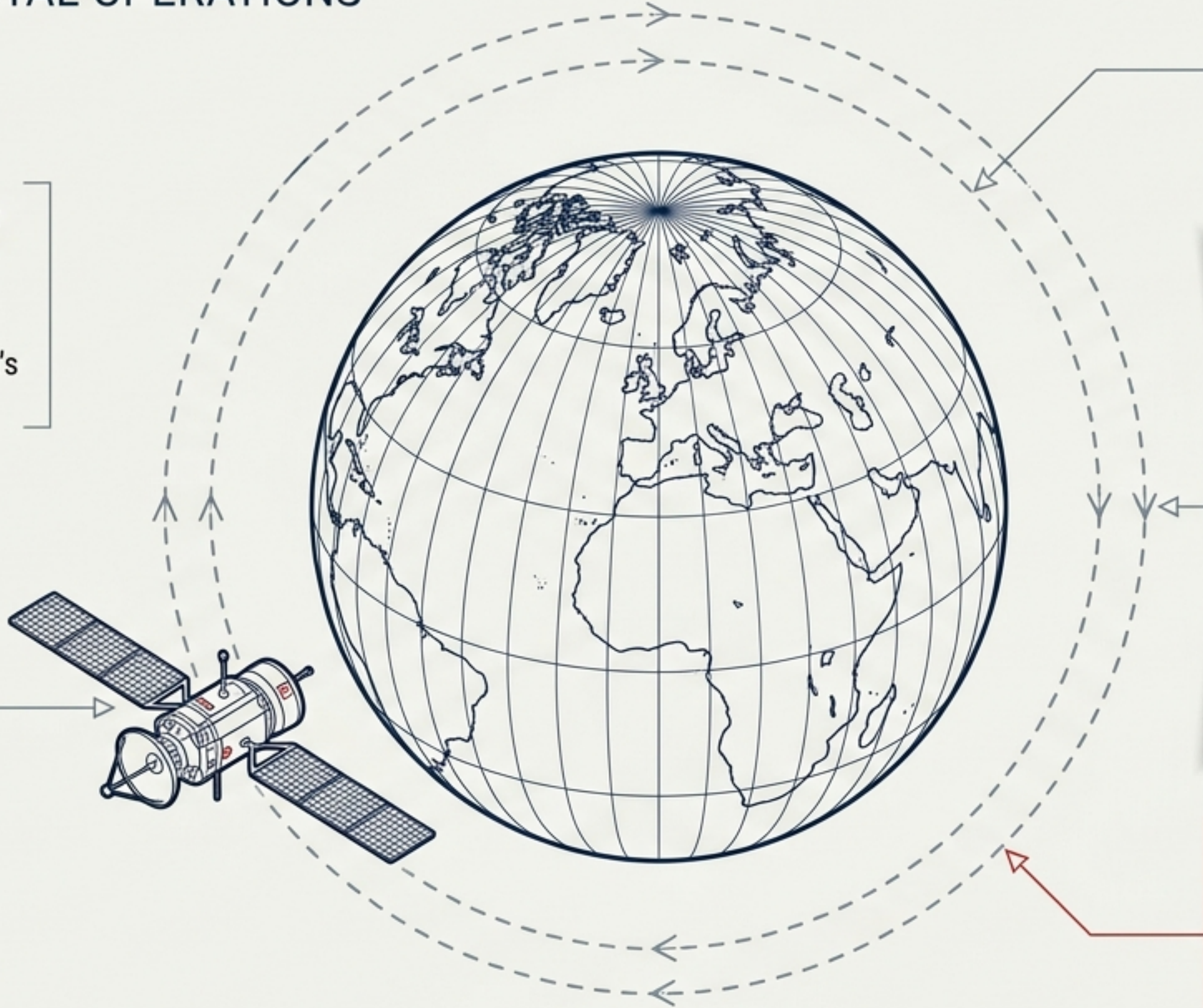
Subject: Unauthorized Pluto Trajectory

On navigational charts, orbits are displayed as dotted lines. In physical space, these paths are invisible gravitational tracks.

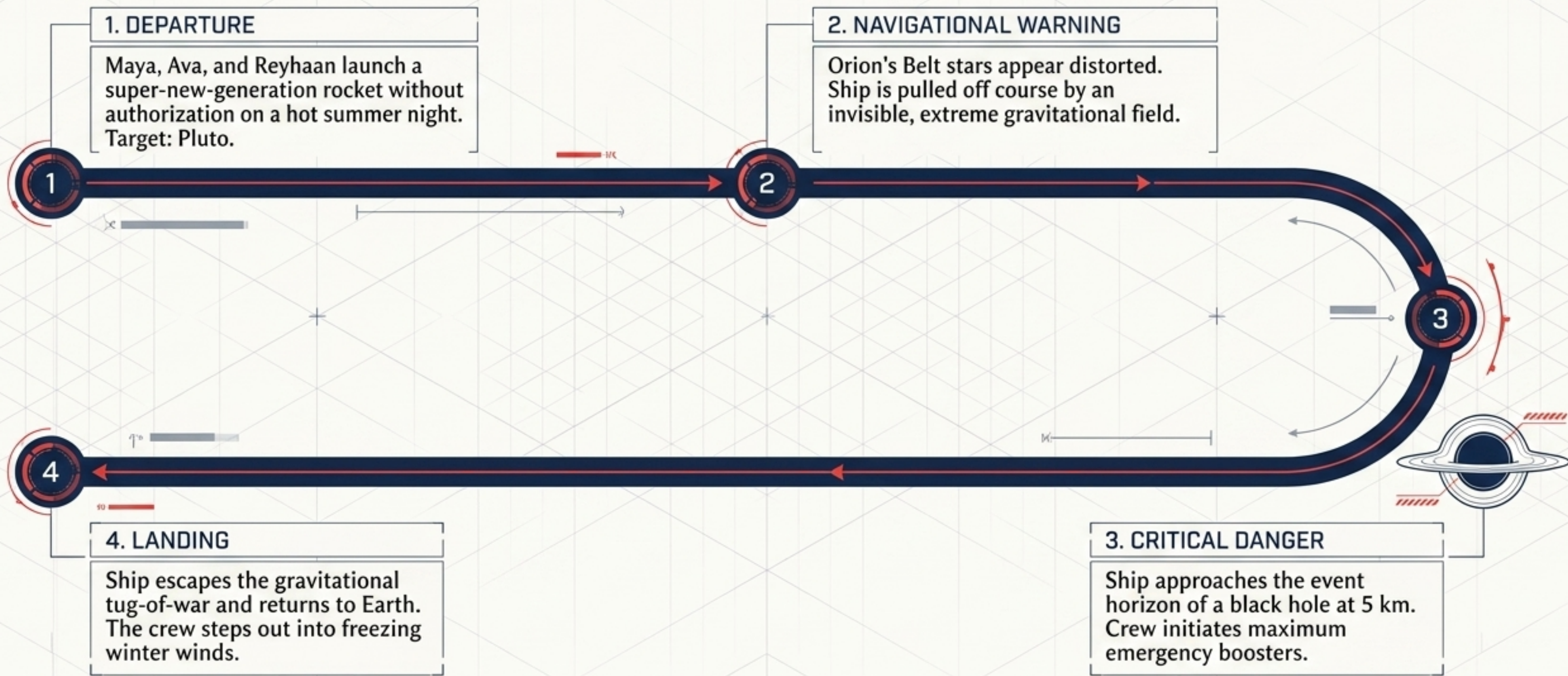


HISTORICAL PRECEDENT:

Stellar Evolution Pathways



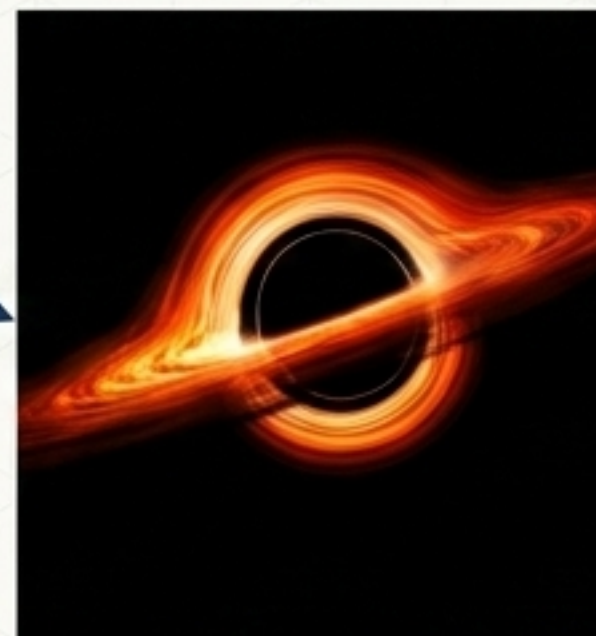
Energy Source:

Event Horizon

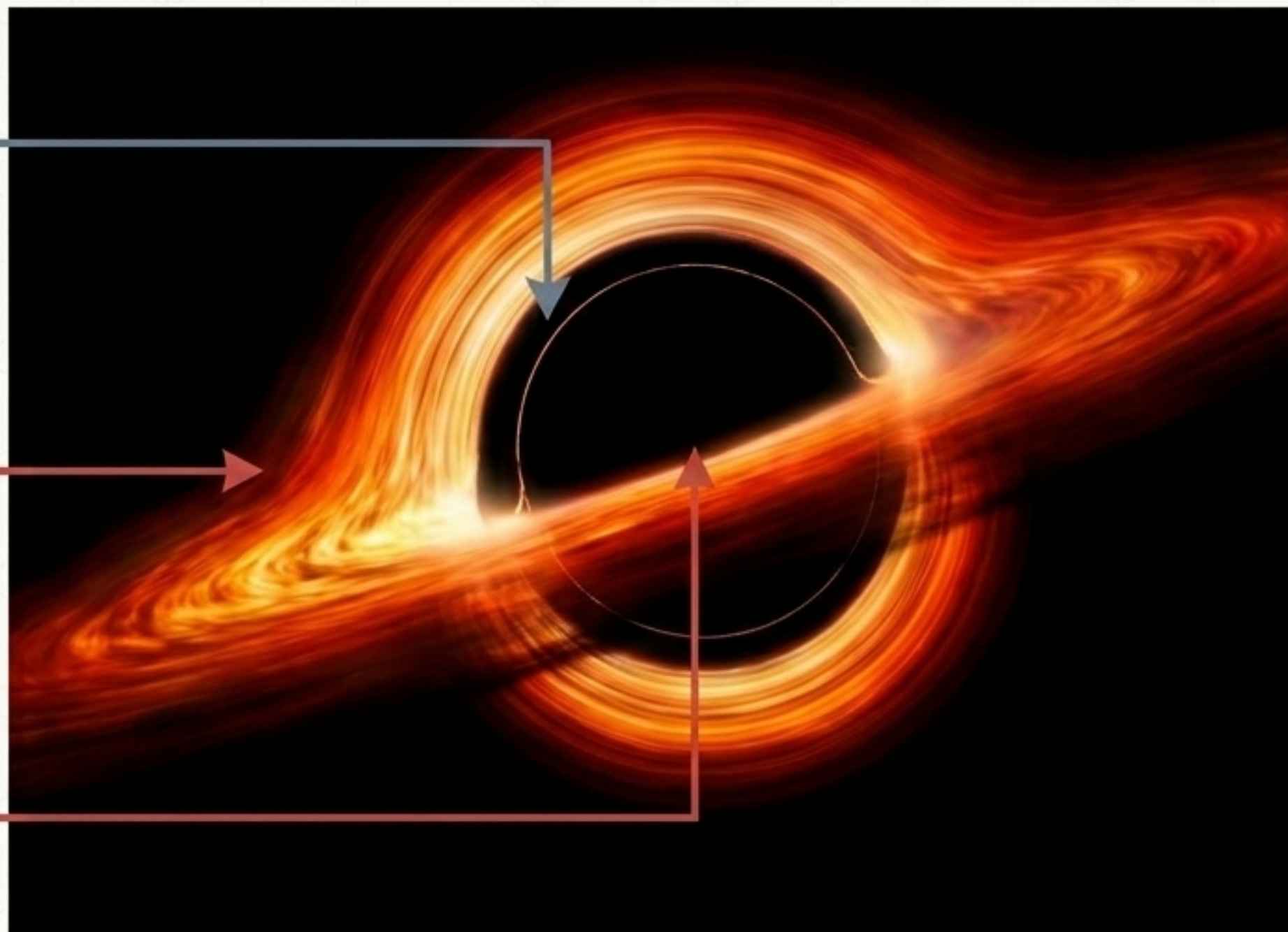
The Point of No Return. A notional boundary beyond which nothing—not even light—can escape. Any ship crossing this line is lost forever.

Gravitational Pull

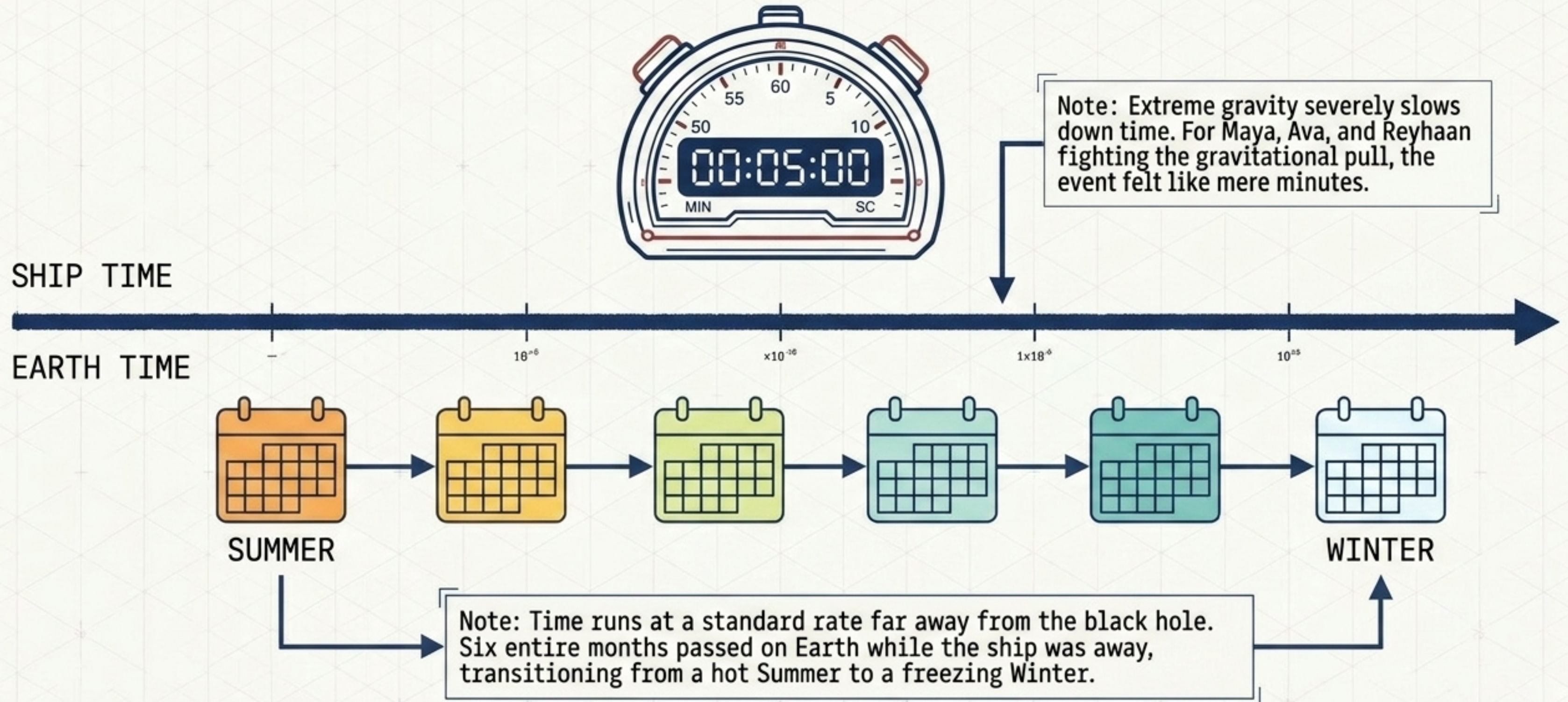
An intense field that bends passing light (acting like a lens) and tears physical matter apart as it is sucked into the center.

Mass Density

The densest objects in the universe. Roughly one black hole exists for every 1,000 stars, with a supermassive one located at the center of our galaxy (mass of millions of suns).

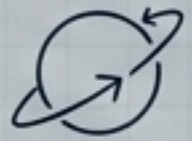
Protocol

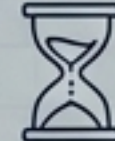
Chronological Matrix: Logging Mission Time



Simple Present Tense

- Example 1: The sun gets its energy by burning hydrogen. (Scientific fact)
- Example 2: Maya tidies up the ship every day. (Regular action)



Simple Past Tense

Protocol: Used for actions that happened sometime before now, signifying a completed event.

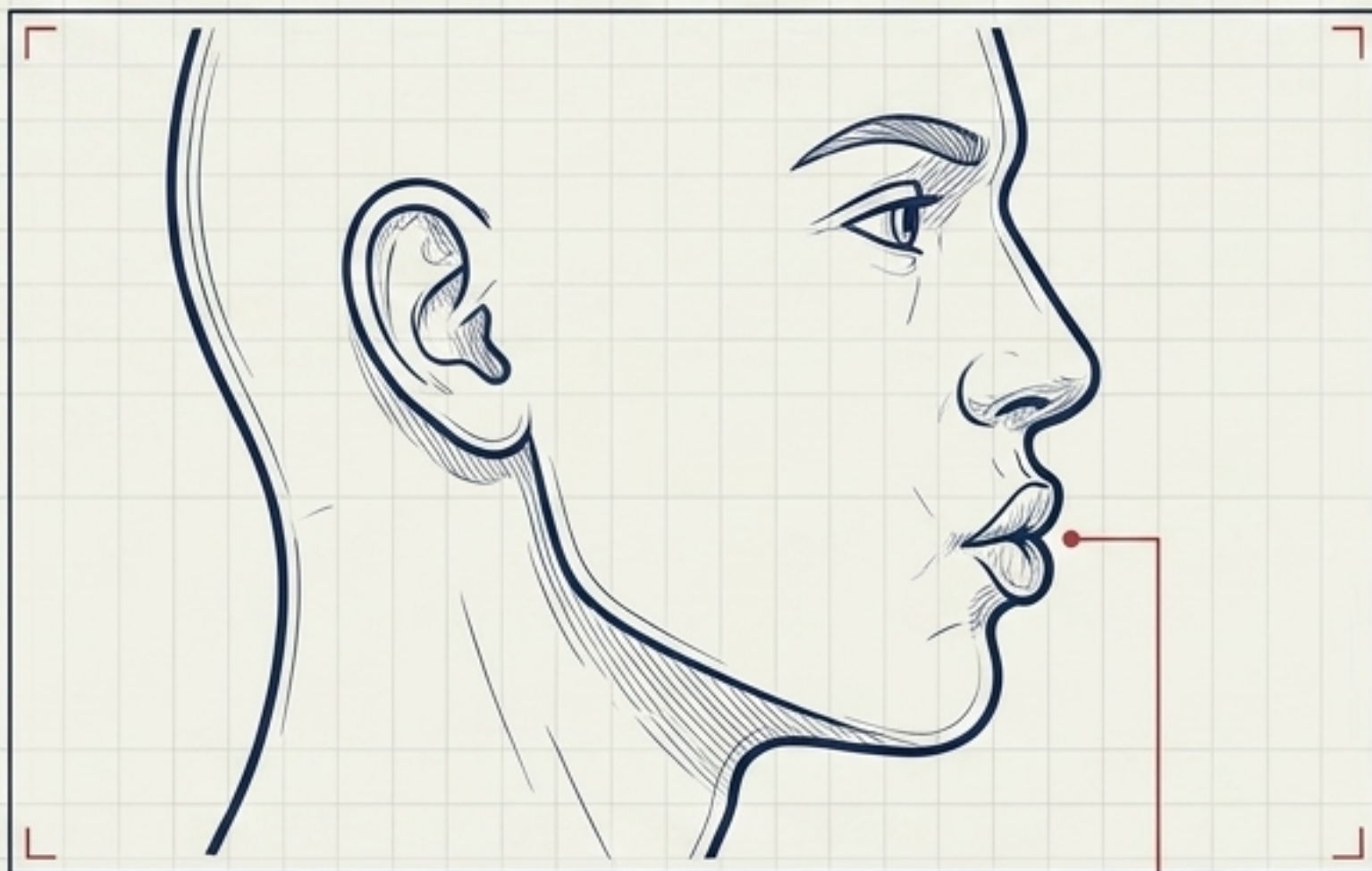
- Example 1: The weather delayed the launch by five days. (Completed event)
- Example 2: India successfully launched its satellite. (Historical fact)

Audio Transmission Mechanics: Phonetics

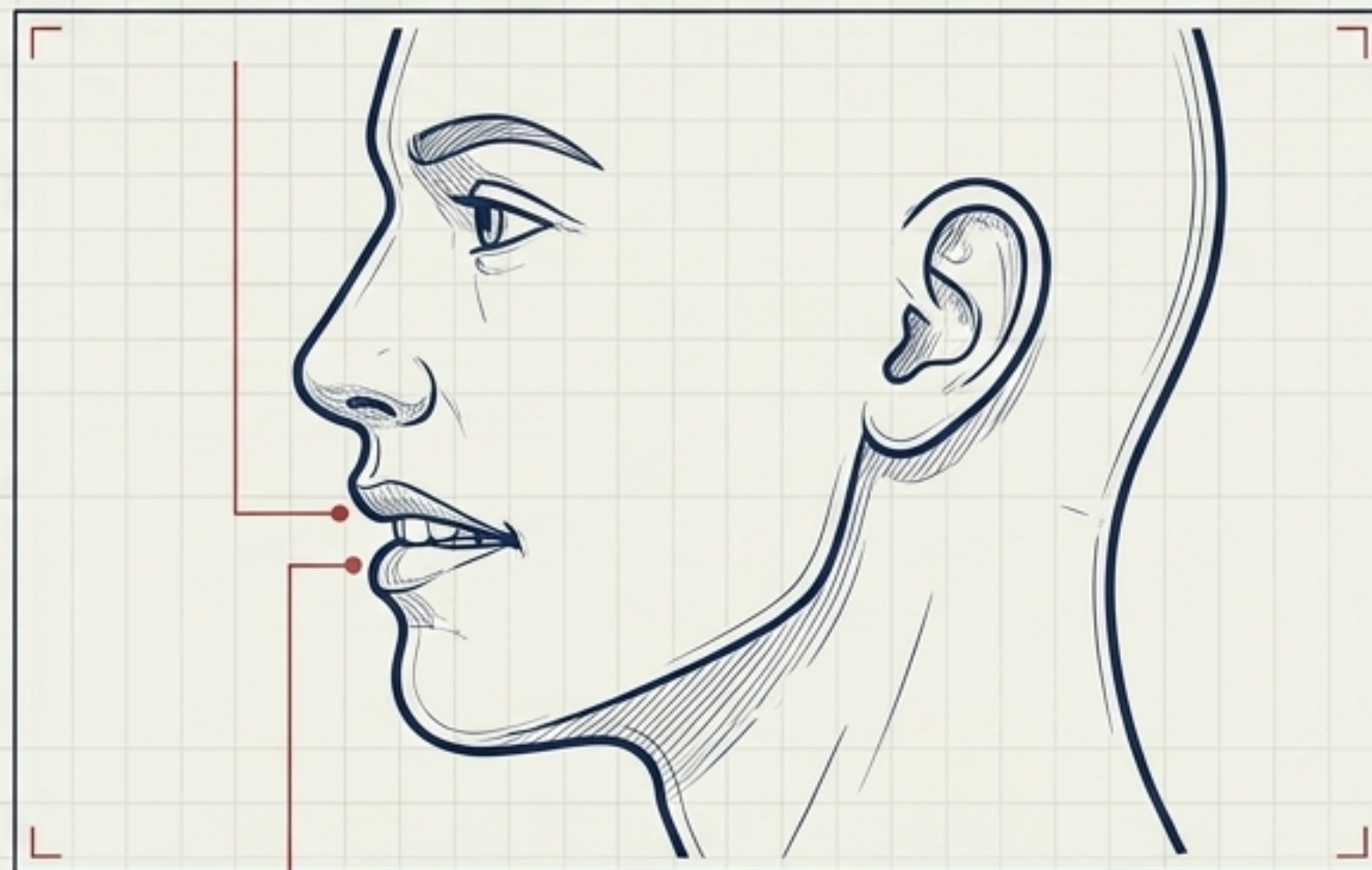
Clear communication is vital in deep space. Distinct mouth movements dictate acoustic clarity.

Audio Testing: While, West, Wallet, Wasp, Water.



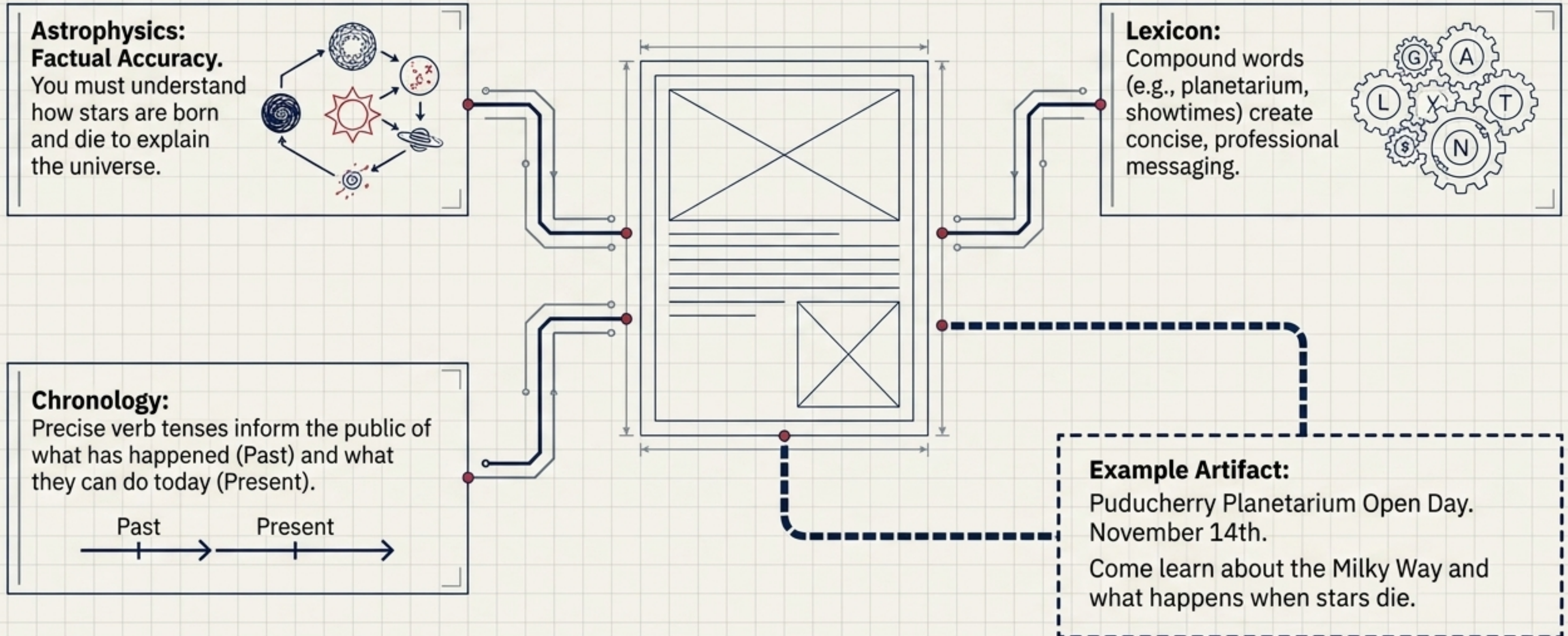
/v/ Sound
